1. SUMMARY




Comparable graphs for the City as a whole for the period 1 April 2019 -October 2019 and the previous reporting period 1 October 2018 – 31 March 2019










Comments from Area Housing Manager Paula Solowij

Fly-tipping has decreased quite substantially and the compactors events in the Abbey & Mackworth Wards may have helped reduce fly tipping in the area.

Garden cases generally increase during this period, which is to be expected during the growing season, however most tenants do respond swiftly to a reminder to improve their gardens.





Fly tipping on Derby Homes land continues to be a relatively low level problem and has shown a slight decline. A new programme of Compactor Events is planned for the remainder of the financial year which will hopefully help to see this as a continuing trend. Repairs and Streetpride issues identified form our patch inspections remain at a fairly static level.

Parking and abandoned vehicles are not an issue in this area at the moment although we expect that parking issues may increase in Chaddesden with the start of the new football season. If this happens we may look at creating new permit schemes on our car parks in this area. Communal issues have increased and this is mainly due to the large number of flats we have in this office area. Staff continue to be proactive on their patch and flat inspections on identifying and following up on these issues, reporting matters through to other departments as and when required.







Comments from Area Housing Manager Lorraine Howe

Fly tipping has seen a decrease; Patch Managers have carried out some targeted campaigning on our Hot Spot areas sending letters and leaflets to residents regarding the consequences of fly-tipping. Compactor Days have started again in September and we will continue to work closely with Neighbourhoods and PPOs. All reported fly-tipping on Derby Homes land is dealt with immediately by our Estate Response Officers.

Streetpride has seen a slight increase. Estate Officers continue to be proactive on their estate inspections, reporting issues through to relevant teams and agencies.

Communal issues has seen an increase since the last report which is to be expected as it is the summer months and we do get more reports of overgrown trees, hedges and grass in communal areas.

Garden cases are high in this area but that is down to the type of estates/properties which is managed by Allenton LHO they are predominantly houses with large gardens and boundary hedges. As the statistics show the cases opened are quickly closed after work has been completed and we only have 8 cases which are over the 3 months stage.

Highway issues and Abandoned Vehicles have seen a slight decline in cases.
