## ATTENDANCE MANAGEMENT

Report of the Chief Executive of Derby Homes

### 1. SUMMARY

To provide details of our attendance rates in 2010/11.

### 2. RECOMMENDATION

To note the contents of the report.

#### 3. MATTER FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The BVPI 12 figure for 2010/11 is 6.78 days. This is within the target of 7.5 days.
- 3.2 In 2009/10 the BVPI 12 figure for Derby Homes was 5.87. For the transferring ESD employees the BVPI12 figure was 14.5 days. This is a combined figure of 8.74 days. We have therefore achieved a significant improvement in overall attendance.
- 3.3 By way of comparison we can report that in 2010/11 the BVPI 12 figure for "old Derby Homes" as 5.4 days and for the transferred staff as 9.1 days.
- 3.4 The Repairs team has experienced a significant improvement in attendance. This can be attributed to:
  - Resolving a number of long term sickness cases
  - The use of First Care a nurse led sickness reporting scheme
  - Consistent support for managers dealing with attendance
  - The Attendance Incentive Scheme
  - The Derby Homes culture to managing performance.
