1. SUMMARY OF REPORT

This report has been produced following the annual round of Equality Impact Assessments.

3. MATTER FOR CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 The Equalities Scheme was approved by Derby Homes Board in July 2007. This scheme includes the arrangements for carrying out Equality Impact Assessments.
- 3.2 Equality Impact Assessments are a systematic way of finding out whether a policy or function affects different groups differently. It is an evidenced-based approach to find out if policies, processes and services benefit all who need to benefit without causing inappropriate disadvantage to others.
- 3.3 In our scheme we have committed ourselves to incorporating Equality Impact Assessments into all reviews and new policies and to have an annual programme of specific Equality Impact Assessments. The results will be published to employees and our customers.
