2. Location of works	Multi-Use Games Area on the corner of Grampian Way and Swallowdale Road, New Sinfin and the Multi-Use Games Area on Shakespeare Street, Old Sinfin.
3. Description of work(s)	18 months community sports delivery to the young people in Old and New Sinfin for 2 sessions per week for the duration of 1.5 hours for Friday evening and 2 hours for Saturday lunchtime. Each session will be delivered by one lead coach and one assistant coach. For each week, there will be one additional hour for the lead coach for the planning and preparation time. Each coach is also paid for the 15 minutes prior to the session for setting up and 15 minutes after the session to ensure that the young people have safely left the area and the area is clean and tidy. The existing funding will run until the end of September 2009 so this project would continue from October 2009 through to the end of March 2011.  The sessions will be targeting at risk children and young people from the ages of 8 through to 16. Engaged young people will be offered the access to other sports sessions linked to Sporting Futures including educational packages such as Community Sports Leaders Awards (CSL) and additional holiday programme activities.  All work carried out will be inputted into our monitoring and evaluation system (web based) which will support and back-up numbers of sessions, young people and engagement levels. This system will also support outcomes (qualifications) and outputs.
4. Why is the work needed?	The children and young people have limited access to structured sport and physical activity, therefore children and young people can become a nuisance and cause antisocial behaviour in the community. Our coaches will target hot spot areas and outreach and guide children and young people to sports sessions and activities with the aim to promoting a safer environment for all who reside in the area.

6. Proof of consultation	Sporting Futures have delivered sports sessions in the Sinfin (New and Old) area for over two years and the past years statistics are shown below.
