10	Skate Park, Chaddesden Park	A contribution to the project.	ASB involving young people is one of the most complained about issues which Derby Homes faces. In many ASB cases investigated by Derby Homes generally the complaints turn out to be no more than youths congregating causing a general nuisance of themselves. When challenged about this young people usually respond by pointing out the lack of facilities and activities for young people to do. High on the list of requested facilities is a skate park. Skateboarding and scootering are extremely popular sports with young people and a great way to exercise. Skate parks encourage young people to get off the streets, they are meeting hub which aids with the engagement efforts of agencies such as Youth Services. There are currently skate parks in Alvaston Park, Bass Rec, Sunny Hill park, Markeaton Park to name a few but none in the north east of the city.
