



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
Fly-tipping - As you can see from the graph as cases are opened they are dealt with immediately by our Estate Response Officers and the Streetpride teams.

1 April 2018 - 30 September

Garden Cases - The amount of garden cases increased during the growing season but the majority are closed after a gentle warning has been given to the tenants. We have also worked closely with the Neighbourhood Teams and held a compactor day event that helped our customers get rid of excess rubbish that they had accumulated at no cost to themselves.

Abandoned Vehicles - Out of the 29 vehicles we have dealt with in total there are 5 outstanding and we are working hard with our customers to get the vehicle roadworthy and resolve these as quickly as possible.



## Narrative from Area Housing Manager Graham Walton

Issues in communal areas and Highways issues have seen an increase over the period, as they have in other parts of the city. Communal issues, which can include tree works and estate improvements, by their nature, can take some time to resolve, hence why a number of the in progress cases are over 3 months old. Streetpride issues have remained stable as they have elsewhere in the city.

Parking problems and numbers of abandoned vehicles on our land have remained fairly static and are not a significant problem in the Sussex Circus management area.

## Narrative from Area Housing Manager Lorraine Howe

Communal and Garden and Issues have seen an increase which is expected through the summer months and when estate officers are carrying out their inspections.

Streetpride and fly tipping on Derby Homes land has remained on a level over the past year. We have been working closely with partners carrying out compactor days and litter picks and to date have collected over 11 tonnes of rubbish. We ensure any reported fly tipping on Derby Homes land is cleared away quickly.

Parking Issues and Abandoned vehicles on Derby Homes land is not a major issue for this management area and we can see there has been a decline in reported abandoned vehicles.
