2. Location of works	Sinfin Moor Park – on the site of the existing play area	
3. Description of work(s)	Wheeled Sports area (suitable for BMX Track, skate boards, roller skating)	
4. Why is the work needed?	Young people have been causing anti social behaviour in and around the Sinfin Area and the Sinfin Moor Park. There is a need for a wheeled sports area where young people can ride their bikes but also use it for roller skates and skate boards in a purpose built facility.	
5. External proof of the ASB issues eg Police reports	Police reports – problems at Cromarty Close on the large concrete area with bikes and skate boards, Community Safety Partnership tasking meetings with reports from partner agencies of nuisance accused by bikes and young people	
6. Proof of consultation	<p>There was a consultation event held at the Scills Centre with around 40 young people on 22 May 2008 where they requested a purpose built facility where they could go to relax, play and use their bikes in a fun environment. When asked what they wanted to take place, results were</p> <p>Ideas of what young people would like in the area</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BMX Track ideally at Redwood Park/Cyber Woods • Shelter/seating preferably near the basket ball area • Lighting around the basket ball area so we can still play there after it is dark • Fencing of the courts repaired and made higher to make is safer for the younger children. • Charity football game between the young people and the Police, to help raise funds. 	

	<p>In addition, a city wide consultation exercise was undertaken called Hooked – Skatepark Design Research Stage One –the final report was produced 22 March 2008. The results state that 336 young people were consulted and the report highlights the health benefits of such a facility which is why the Primary Care Trust is keen to get involved with this project, along with the Sinfin Neighbourhood Team due to the ASB and wanting to prove positive activities for young people as part of the Sinfin board priorities.</p> <p>The Parks Department have received £150k from the Council and external funding to redevelop the play areas on the park. They have shown the BMX Track/Wheeled sports area within their plans which have been through a wide consultation process – being taken to the Sinfin Forums and Board and to the Sinfin Library and at Asda. Parks have been clear that they do not have the funds to develop this site, but that it has been requested during consultation at schools and in the area, therefore they have shown it within their plans.</p>
7. Actual take up and number of properties benefiting. (Include numbers of tenants and leaseholders/owner occupiers)	Derby Homes has a number of properties in the Sinfin Ward and given that this is a public park, in theory all households with young people could benefit from this facility.
8. Costs (quotes, SORs etc)	The area would require a total budget of around £40k. We are requesting £5k from Derby Homes, £25k from the Sinfin Neighbourhood Team and £10k from the PCT.
9. Map and photo of area and any other information e.g. planning	The facility would be on Sinfin Moor Park. The intention is for the Parks Department to project manage the development and implementation of this site with support from the Sinfin Neighbourhood Team.
